Frisbie Elementary School participated in the Keep Connecticut Cool contest that was judged on June 4, 2011. The contest is for Connecticut students in grades 4-12 to create climate change solutions in their schools and communities. The Frisbie team consisted of a group of driven students and their mentor Janet Discepolo.

The Frisbie team accomplished both community outreach and education including:

- Holding a Community Go Green Day at which they handed out new town recycling guidelines.
- Played recycling games to help test children's recycling knowledge.
- Made green cleaners from vinegar and lemon juice for household usage and gave away CFL bulbs and recycle bins.
- Held a recycled art contest, encouraged carpooling through raffle tickets, and much more.

The Frisbie team made a difference in their community through demonstration and promotion of less wasteful and more ecofriendly alternatives to daily lifestyles. Through their extraordinary efforts and teamwork they won the \$2500 Best Overall Project prize and shared a portion of the Best Collaboration prize.
